

Waiting for Brain Injury Inpatient Rehabilitation

Your healthcare team has recommended that you go to an inpatient rehabilitation program. When a spot becomes available, one of the rehabilitation hospitals will call you to arrange for your admission.

What happens in rehab?

Your rehab team will assess your needs and plan a therapy program to help you improve function. Goals may address strength, balance, movement, thinking skills, memory skills, and possibly more.

Treatment is provided by your clinical team which may include Physiotherapists, Occupational Therapists, Speech Language Pathologists, Social Workers, Recreational Therapists, Psychologists, Physicians, and Nurses.

Inpatient rehab means that you stay in the hospital overnight, but the rehab team will speak to you about going home on weekends.
